Standard Operating Procedure 2023-1

Title: Volunteer Emergency Communication Chain

Purpose: To direct actions for the volunteer team members to safely communicate with emergency services on behalf of citizens during an emergency

Applies to: All private citizens volunteering to assist.

Training required:

- 1. SOP signoff
- 2. Radio class
- 3. Eversource outage map access

Resources required:

- 4. Sharon town map territory assignment
- 5. Sharon town emergency vest
- 6. Radio

NOTE: In the event of an emergency, *your safety is the first priority*. Do not attempt to go door to door unless you can safely navigate hazards and are in adequate physical condition to do so.

- 1. Check radio equipment to ensure that it is charged.
- 2. Check list of residences in your territory
- 3. Wear appropriate clothing for the elements boots, coat, yak traks or similar as needed.
- 4. Put on Sharon NH emergency vest.
- 5. Secure radio for travel between houses.
- 6. Notify EMD or designee that you are starting rounds, and time when you expect to finish.
- 7. Walk or drive if safe to houses in your territory.
- 8. If resident requests assistance, call 911 on radio. Notify EMD of your location, nature or emergency, and of any requests for assistance..
  - a. Stay with resident until 911 arrives in the event of illness or injury..
  - b. Only provide assistance that you are trained for and can safely perform.
    - i. If the emergency is NOT human injury or illness, return to route.
  - c. Notify EMD when emergency services arrive and you return to your route.
- 9. Upon finishing route, notify EMD you have finished.
- 10. Recharge radio and store vest.
- 11. After action reporting: email summary of incident and questions or suggestions for improvements to EMD for discussion at next team meeting.
